An Order Declaring the Results of the Primary Election Held on May 17, 2016 Regarding the Establishment and Formation of a Deschutes County Chapter 451 Service District For Emergency Communication Services; Simultaneous Withdrawal of Property

* ORDER NO. 2016-023

WHEREAS, an election in Deschutes County, Oregon and Jefferson County, Oregon was held on May 17, 2016 on the measure set forth in Exhibit A concerning the proposed formation of an ORS Chapter 451 county service district for emergency communications ("District"); and

WHEREAS, an Abstract of Votes, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit B, shows that a majority of those persons voting voted to approve the measure; and

WHEREAS, ORS 198.820(1) requires the Board to canvass the votes and enter an Order establishing and forming the District if the Board determines that the majority of the votes cast were in support of formation of the District; now, therefore,

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DESCHUTES COUNTY, OREGON, ORDERS as follows:

Section 1. At the election held in both Deschutes County, Oregon and Jefferson County, Oregon, on May 17, 2016, as evidenced by the Abstract of Votes, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit B and incorporated by reference herein, 48,782 electors cast ballots on the issue of formation of the District (with simultaneous withdrawal) and, of those electors, 34,932 electors voted YES, and 13,850 voted NO on the measure captioned FORM 9-1-1 DISTRICT WITH PERMANENT RATE, WITHDRAW FROM EXISTING DISTRICT, as set forth in the attached Exhibit A, incorporated by reference herein.

Section 2. Because the majority of electors voted in support, the measure is declared to have PASSED.

Section 3. Consistent with, and pursuant to ORS Chapter 198:

- a. The District is hereby established and formed and shall be known as: “Deschutes County 9-1-1 Service District.”
- b. The District’s purpose is to take all necessary and proper steps to plan, establish, furnish and maintain a 9-1-1 emergency communications system within Deschutes County and to construct, maintain and operate any related facilities pursuant to ORS 451.010 et seq.
- c. The District Boundary shall be substantially as legally described in Exhibit C and depicted on the map attached as Exhibit D.

Section 4. The County Legal Department shall cause certified copies of this Order to be filed with the Deschutes County Clerk and Assessor and the Oregon Department of Revenue and Secretary of State pursuant to ORS 198.780(1).

Should a new 9-1-1 district be formed with a \$0.425/\$1,000 permanent tax rate beginning 2016-2017, and current district territory withdrawn?

Summary 175 words which concisely and impartially summarizes the measure and its major effect.

Since 1990, the 9-1-1 Service District has depended on temporary tax measures to fund 9-1-1 emergency and non-emergency call-taking and police, fire and EMS dispatch services for District residents. The 9-1-1 User Board, comprised of all local police and fire chiefs, adopted a strategic plan to improve 9-1-1 service and replace the end of life radio communications system by establishing stable funding prior to the expiration of the existing, temporary operating levy in 2018. Stable funding would assure the continuation of quality, responsive 9-1-1 emergency service responses for everyone in the District.

This new tax would replace both the current permanent tax rate of \$.1618 and the expiring temporary rate of \$.20. The Governing Board has committed to maintaining the levy rate at \$.3618, the current level, for the next two years.

The maximum levy rate of \$.4250 is not expected to be reached until 2030 or later. If levied at the maximum amount, the total increase over the current levies on a property with an assessed value of \$200,000 would be \$1.05 per month.





EXHIBIT C

Deschutes County as described in ORS 201.090 as follows: Beginning at the southeast corner of township 22 south, range 23 east of the Willamette Meridian; thence westerly along township lines to the summit of the Cascade Range; thence northerly along the summit of the Cascade Range to the line between township 13 and 14 south; thence easterly along such township line to the northeast corner of township 14 south, range 13 east; thence southerly along the east line of range 13 east to the southwest corner of township 16 south, range 14 east; thence easterly to the southeast corner of such township; thence southerly along the range line to the southwest corner of township 18 south, range 15 east; thence easterly along township lines to the northwest corner of township 19 south, range 17 east; thence southerly to the southwest corner of such township; thence easterly to the northeast corner of township 20 south, range 19 east; thence southerly to the southeast corner of such township; thence easterly to the northeast corner of township 21 south, range 20 east; thence southerly to the southeast corner of such township; thence easterly to the range line between ranges 23 and 24 east; thence southerly along such range line to the place of beginning.

The portion of Jefferson County served by the Sisters - Camp Sherman Rural Fire Protection District as follows: Beginning at the corner common to townships 13 and 14 south, ranges 9 and 10 east, Willamette Meridian, Oregon; thence northerly, on the line common to said ranges 9 and 10, 4 miles more or less, to the southwest corner of section 7, township 13 south, range 10 east; thence easterly, 1.0 mile more or less, to the southeast corner of said section 7; thence northerly, 1.5 miles more or less, on the east lines of sections 7 and 6, to the east quarter corner of said section 6; thence westerly, 1.0 mile more or less, to the west quarter corner of said section 6, on said range line; thence northerly, 1.5 miles more or less, on said range line, to the northwest corner of section 31, township 12 south, range 10 east, Willamette Meridian; thence easterly, 3.0 miles more or less on the north line of sections 31, 32 and 33, to the northeast corner of said section 33; thence northerly, 5.0 miles more or less, on the east line of sections 28, 21, 16, 9 and 4 of township 12 south, range 10 east, Willamette Meridian, to the northeast corner of said section 4; thence westerly, 3.0 miles more or less on the north line of sections 4, 5 and 6, to the northwest corner of section 6, also being the corner common to townships 11 and 12 south, ranges 9 and 10 east, Willamette Meridian; thence northerly, 6.0 miles more or less, on the line common to ranges 9 and 10 east, to a point on the south line of section 31, township 10 south, range 10 east, Willamette Meridian; thence northerly, continuing on the extension of the range line common to ranges 9 and 10 east, in township 11 south, 0.6 miles more or less, to its intersection with the "thread of the Metolius River", being a point on the southern boundary of the "Warm Springs Indian Reservation", and also being the terminus of this "line description".
