("Summary" Attachment to SEL 803)

Voters approved formation of La Pine Park & Recreation District to provide the community with park, recreation, and cultural enrichment experiences. The District's tax base, approved in 2009, is 30 cents per \$1,000 assessed value. The proposed levy of 22 cents would supplement the tax base for a period of 5 years, commencing in November, 2019.

Levy funds would:

- Provide security systems
- Address deferred maintenance of District owned properties, allowing them to stay available to the community.
- Expand health, wellness, fitness, and active outdoor programs for adults.
- Support and expand current youth programs for children from kindergarten to high school with adequate supplies, materials and personnel.
- Fund necessary upgrades in technology/media, and service.

A home with an assessed value (not market value) of \$200,000 would pay \$44.00 per year (or \$3.67 per month).

Estimated revenue for each year from the local option levy:

\$ 180,700 in 2019-2020

\$ 186,121 in 2020-2021

\$ 191,704 in 2021-2022

\$ 197,455 in 2022-2023

\$ 203,379 in 2023-2024
