Voters approved formation of Sisters Park and Recreation District to provide the community with park, recreation, and cultural enrichment experiences. The District's tax base, approved in 1998, is currently 22¢ per \$1,000 assessed value. The proposed levy of 15¢ would supplement the tax base.

Levy funds would help:

- ▶ Support youth programs offered to children from preschool through high school. In 2017, there were over 3,000 separate registrations for SPRD youth programs.
- Increase access to after-school and youth recreation programs by lowering fees to allow participation regardless of income.
- Expand health, wellness, fitness, and active outdoor programs for adults. In 2017 over 1,000 adults participated in current programs.
- Fund community events like the Luau, Buried Beef, Kids Appreciation Day, and Community Dinners attended by over 1,500 in 2016.
- Address deferred maintenance of District-owned baseball and softball fields, Skate Park, Disc Golf Course, and Coffield Community Center so these facilities continue to be available to the community.

A home with an assessed value (not market value) of \$276,000 would pay \$41.40 per year.
