| Deschutes Soil and Water Conservation District serves all of Deschutes County. The District services promote voluntary efforts to conserve water, protect drinking water supply, improve soil health for local farms and agriculture, support forest health, reduce wildfire risk, enhance fish/wildlife habitat, control invasive weeds, restore streams, and conserve natural areas and green spaces. The District does not make or enforce regulations. The District is currently funded through short-term grants. The District has conducted a thorough assessment of natural resource needs and asks voters to approve a permanent rate limit in which the maximum amount the District can levy is \$0.06 per \$1,000 assessed value. This rate by law cannot be raised. If the maximum amount is levied, it will cost no more than \$14.28 per year on an average property value assessed at \$238,000. The revenue raised will allow the District to provide education, technical assistance, and fund conservation efforts through projects for urban and rural communities, farmers, foresters, businesses, schools, and agencies. District financial reports are audited annually and available to the public. | | | | |
