

Deschutes County Juvenile Community Justice EMANCIPATION CHECKLIST FOR MINORS

Emancipation is a legal process that requires several steps and is decided by a judget at a court hearing.

You are responsible for completing the following items during the process:

- □ Complete *Emancipation Intake Information Form* (will be provided to you)
- □ Sign and file a completed *Application for Decree of Emancipation* (will be provided to you) with the Circuit Court.
- □ Pay the required filing fee for the *Application for Decree of Emancipation* at the time you file it with the Circuit Court.
- □ Complete and serve a legal summons (will be provided to you) to your parent/legal guardian to notify them of your emancipation hearing, which is scheduled for you at the time of filing the *Application for Decree of Emancipation* with the Circuit Court.
 - A copy of the *Application for Decree of Emancipation* must be served along with the summons, by certified mail, with the return receipt provided to the Circuit Court at the time of the hearing.
- □ Attend an emancipation court hearing. Bring the following information to the emancipation court hearing:
 - 1. Proof of employment (most recent pay check stubs)
 - 2. Completed "Budget Form" (will be provided to you)
 - 3. Five year goal statement
 - 4. Bank statements checking & savings, if available
 - 5. If using income other than employment as a basis for emancipation, proof of that income is required
 - 6. Letters of recommendation or support from ADULTS that have known you for a significant period of time, such as employers, school counselors, pastor, etc.
- □ If emancipation is granted, bring a certified copy of *Empancipation Decree* to the Department of Motor Vehicles to change minor status on your drivers license or identity card.
