Who is eligible?



We serve individuals diagnosed with intellectual and developmental disabilities.



The condition must be **expected to last a lifetime**.

2 SKILLS IMPACTED

The condition must impact at least two everyday living skills.

Examples include self care, communication, learning, socialization, mobility and self-direction.

The onset of the condition must have occurred prior to age 22. Examples of potential qualifying conditions:

- » Intellectual Disability (IQ of 75 or below)*
- » Down Syndrome
- » Autism
- » Cerebral Palsy
- » Epilepsy
- » Fetal Alcohol/Drug Effects
- » Traumatic Brain Injury

Case Management

- » Develop annual goals
- » Information and referral
- » IEP collaboration
- » Choice Advising

Foster/Residential Care

- » Choice of provider
- » Foster, residential and supported living options
- » Increased monitoring by Services Coordinator to ensure health and safety

All services are person centered and may vary from client to client. To best plan for your needs, please contact your Services Coordinator

K plan

- » Assist with obtaining Medicaid
- » Funded support planning which can include relief care, respite care, behavioral supports, and employment supports
