

COVID-19 Case Counts by Week





(Dashed lines = 95% Confidence Intervals)




Redmond COVID-19 Cases by Week










COVID-19 Vaccinations by Age Group






COVID-19 Vaccinations by Race/Ethnicity

When to get tested?

- Before and after travel*
- If you have symptoms
- 6 to 9 days after you were exposed to someone who tests positive




Testing for travel

- Know the requirements most locations require PCR test results within 72 hours
- Visit <u>www.deschutes.org/covidtesting</u>
- Find a location on the OHA testing locator that meets your needs
- Call ahead to confirm test type and turnaround time
- Get tested and travel safely!

Changes to mask guidelines and practices

- Most OR mask requirements lifted. Still encouraged if you're not yet vaccinated.
- Masks required at: healthcare facilities, certain workplaces required by OR-OSHA, businesses that require masks, planes, busses, trains, transportation hubs, jails and correctional facilities.
- Some people may choose to continue wearing masks due to medical conditions, personal preference, loved one who is high risk, etc.




Changes to mask guidelines and practices

- 1) DC Health Services clinics are continuing our phased approach to re-opening; at most clinic sites (at least for BH), in-person services are now the default mode of providing care
- 2) As health clinics under the Governor's/OHAs guidance, masks remain mandatory regardless of vaccination status; the only exception to masks is if someone is alone in a private office.
