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Omicron may cause milder illness

But the record number of cases is leading to a record number of hospital admissions

Delta: 164,000



Predicted COVID Hospital Census


- These are predictions for "patient throughput" not midnight census.
- On average, 85
 hospital beds
 occupied by COVID
 patients over the past
 2 weeks.
- On average 65
 hospital beds
 occupied in the next 2
 weeks.
- Cautiously optimistic that we will remain on a steep decline from the omicron surge.






Deschutes County Vaccination Status







Hospitalized COVID-19 Patient Count: Fully Vaccinated by Age Group


- 93% of the patients under 65 are not fully vaccinated.
- 78% of the patients 65 and over are not fully vaccinated.
- Not fully vaccinated patients are on average 13 years younger than fully vaccinated patients.



Note: "Fully Vaccinated" means two doses of Pfizer or Moderna, or 1 dose of J&J.




Distribution of COVID Patients by Vaccination Status and Age Group






Vaccination by Age Group








Vaccination by Race & Ethnicity
