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Take Home Messages

- Shift in Containment Strategy.
 - Do Not Expect a Phone Call or Letters
 - Visit the <u>new Oregon website for people who test positive for COVID-19</u>
 - Call the Oregon Health Authority COVID-19 Support Line at 866-917-8881
- Testing is currently constrained.
- Plenty of vaccines. Get vaccinated. Get boosted.
- Hospital admissions are on the rise again.



Shift in COVID response strategy

- The sustained and increasing number of cases have <u>outgrown</u> our containment capacity and response for several months.
- With this surge in cases, Oregon Health Authority is leading a <u>shift in the</u> <u>direction</u> of the COVID-19 response.
- Overall goal is shifting from preventing transmission to <u>reducing severity</u> and <u>hospitalization</u>.
- The tools and strategies will also shift towards <u>vaccination</u>, <u>testing</u>, <u>public</u> <u>information</u>/ <u>education</u>, <u>wrap around services and outbreak response</u>.



County goals


Priorities and resource allocation:

- Obligations: wrap around services, isolation motel and outbreak response.
- Vaccination and testing, among top 5 counties
 - Service quality, cost and quality
- Public information: timely, accurate information and support line.






Foundational capacity

COVID: ARPA Financial Update




- Average weekly December expense = \$63K
- At current rate, funds will last through late February
- Evaluating structure and ongoing temporary supports based on service levels.



Medical System

Share of Occupied Beds by COVID-19 Patients

- On average COVID-19
 patients have occupied
 9% of the hospital beds
 and 29% of the ICU
 beds.
- In January COVID-19
 patients have occupied
 30% of all the beds and
 15% of the ICU beds.



Omicron Impact on Emergency Departments


- Omicron being less severe increases ED visits.
- More patients that are ill, but not severe enough to be admitted.
- Additional stress on an already stressed resource.





Omicron and Pediatric Patients


- Omicron is even more Impactful on pediatric ED visits.
- Pediatric admissions to the hospital are also expected to reach a new high level.





Hospitalized COVID-19 Patient Count: Fully Vaccinated vs. Not Fully Vaccinated by Age Group

- 93% of the patients under 65 are not fully vaccinated.
- 76% of the patients 65 and over are not fully vaccinated.
- Not fully vaccinated patients are on average 14 years younger than fully vaccinated patients.


Summary Comments

- Peak for Oregon is estimated to occur in the last few days of January. Central Oregon will experience the peak of the surge in mid-February.
- Hospital system is already strained due to staffing shortages and additionally stressed due to furloughed caregivers.
- The omicron variant is less severe if you are fully vaccinated and even less severe if you are boosted. Not so much if you are unvaccinated.




Case Counts and Rates


Vaccination by Age Group






Vaccination by Race & Ethnicity






Vaccination by Zip Code
