

This is a Health Alert Network Advisory

Summary

Deschutes County Health Services (DCHS) is issuing notification of a potential increase in non-fatal overdoses due to opioids which occurred in Bend between November 1st and November 8th, 2025 (n=11). This does **not** meet the Deschutes County clinical threshold for an overdose spike. However, due to the atypical severity of the overdoses, DCHS is asking healthcare providers to share information with relevant staff, patients, and clients. DCHS is monitoring data sources and may update the alert as the situation changes.

Information currently available:

- The increase in non-fatal overdoses has been limited to Bend.
- All cases are stated to involve opioids, fentanyl, or narcotics.
- Some of the cases have required repeated or continuous dosing of Naloxone.
- There have been zero overdose fatalities reported during this time period.

Recommendations for Healthcare Providers:

- Confirm your Naloxone supply is stocked and easily accessible to staff.
- Prescribe Naloxone in tandem with prescribed pain medication.
- Practice client centered care to identify substance use treatment needs.

The Overdose Prevention and Response Coalition recommends the following communication strategies to be used with patients and clients:

- Be calm and avoid inciting fear.
- Use harm reduction messaging such as encouraging people to not use alone or sharing the never use alone phone or online resources.
- Ask if individuals have access to Naloxone or if they need a prescription for it.
- Share appropriate resources for harm reduction and treatment.
