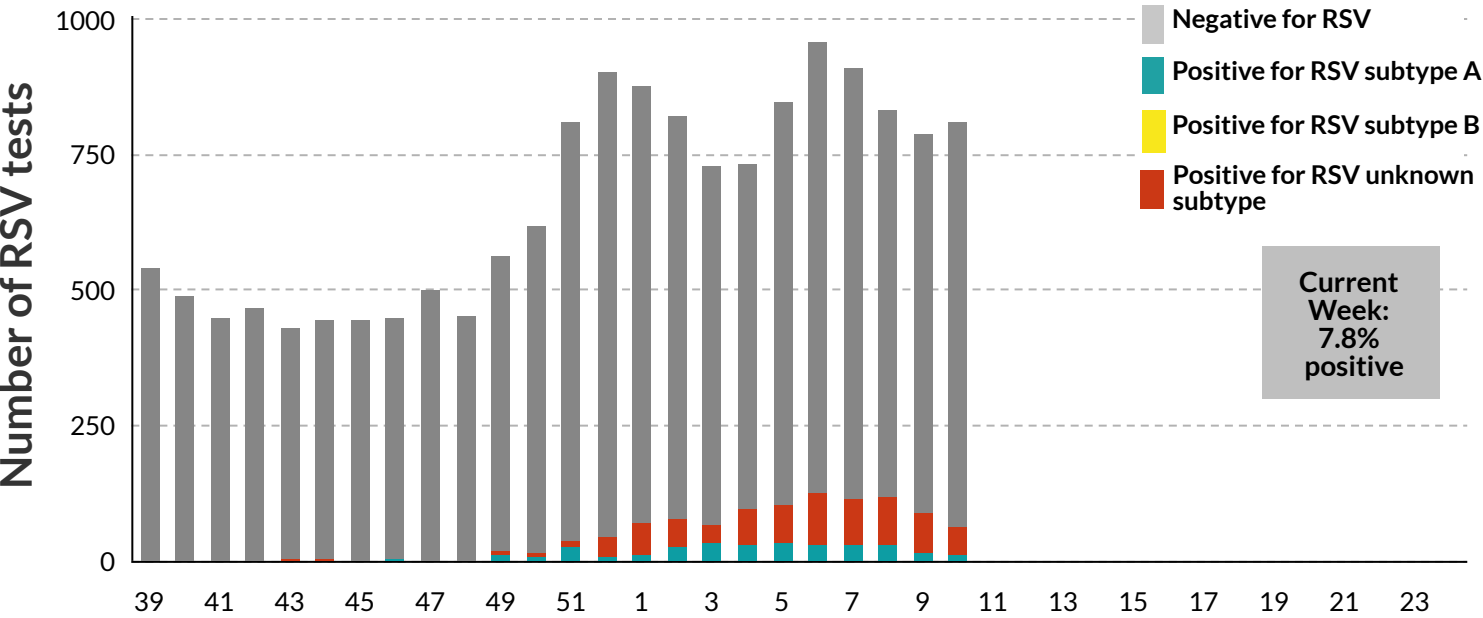

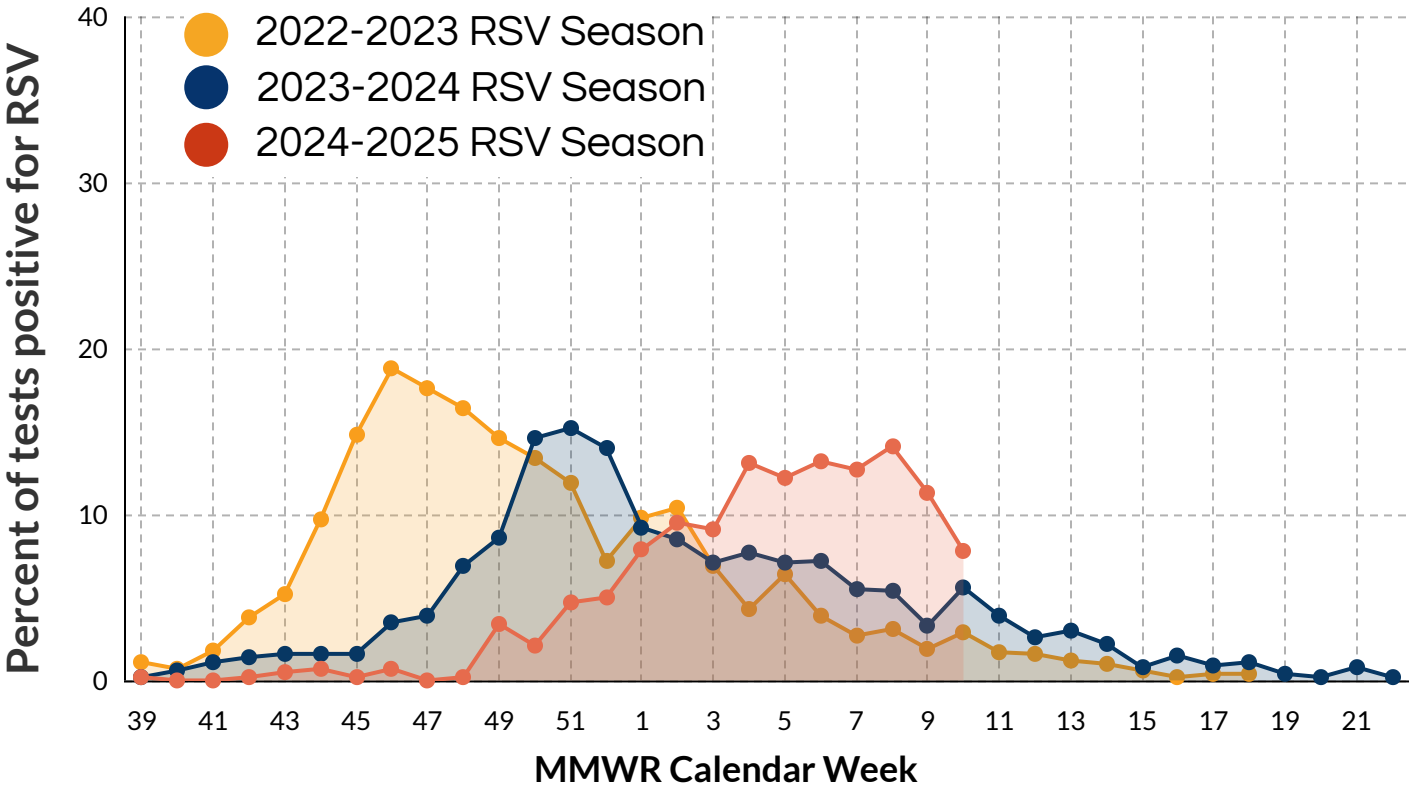
## Weekly number of reported RSV tests and proportion of positive tests

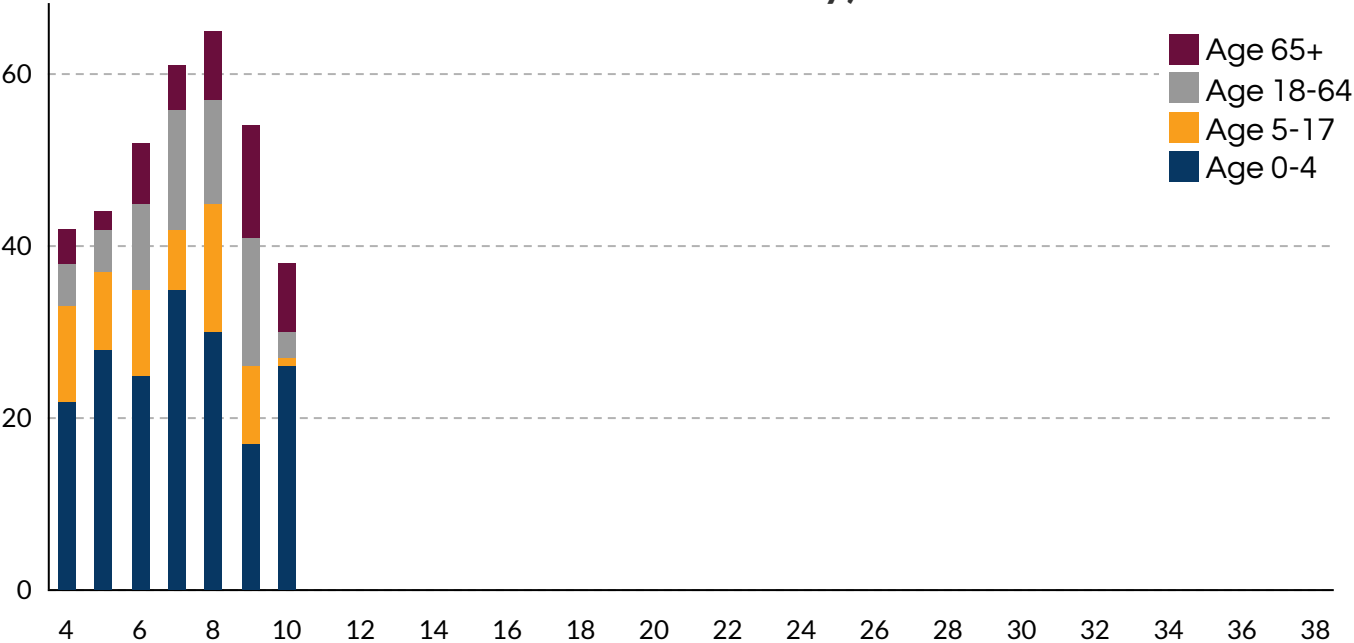
Data Source for Central OR lab reporting (graphic above & directly below): National Respiratory & Enteric Virus Surveillance System (NREVSS), a laboratory-based system that monitors temporal & geographic circulation patterns (occurring in a certain time/place) for an array of respiratory viruses. Participating laboratories (including a few in Central OR) report the total # of weekly aggregated tests; aggregated positive tests; along with specimen type/location & week of collection. From the above, week 38 corresponds to September 17-23, 2023.
