Items Requiring Follow-up in Red

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 9:07 a.m. by Chad Centola, Deschutes County Solid Waste Director.

- 1. Review/Approve Minutes:** Chad Centola
Chad Centola asked for comments on the minutes from the May 17, 2022 meeting. **Action:** Jared Black made the motion and Chris Ogren seconded to approve the minutes from the prior meeting. The committee unanimously approved the minutes as written.
- 2. Public Comment:** Chad Centola
No public comments.
- 3. Criteria Update: Comments received, Board Presentation, discussion of Criteria:** Chad Centola

- Chad referenced the recent meeting with the Board of Commissioners to discuss the draft siting criteria. He noted there was one change requested by Commissioner Chang to increase the ‘distance to waste centroid’ weighting criteria. That change was included and the engineering weighting was decreased.
- The Board will review and potentially approve the criteria in their June 22, 2022 meeting.
- Once the Board approves the criteria, Parametrix will move forward with the county-wide screening and applying the siting criteria to winnow down the list of potential locations.

4. Lake County Landfill Video and Board Opinion: Chad Centola

- Chad shared a brief *Central Oregon Daily News* video from May 23 [‘Landfill 40-times larger than Knott may come to Lake County’](#) about the Lake County Landfill.
- Chad noted Deschutes County intends to continue looking at siting a new facility within Deschutes County and is not planning a change in direction.
- It was noted the memorandum of understanding referenced in the video is between Lake County and Jensen Development.
- The potential Lake County location would be roughly 8,000-acres, including the facility site and buffer. They are considering rail opportunities to bring waste to the facility. By comparison, Deschutes County is considering a 250-acre facility with a buffer.
- Robin Vora asked whether Lake County is pursuing their project to address long-term capacity needs. Chad responded that there’s potential economic benefit from a large regional facility.
- Keith Kessar commented that the video had helpful information and that he was also glad to hear Deschutes County is still continuing with their planned path.

5. Wrap up/adjourn and Tour of Knott Landfill: Chad Centola
