Materials Definitions

Commingled Recyclables: Newspaper, cardboard, aluminum and tin cans, plastic food and beverage containers, catalogs, magazines, junk mail, and paperboard. No plastic bags or clamshell food containers.

Yard Debris: Leaves, grass, tree trimmings, and stumps (<12" diameter). Yard debris must be free of dirt and rocks.

Appliances: Residential refrigerators, freezers, ranges, dishwashers, air conditioners, washers, and dryers.

Wood Waste: Lumber, particle board, plywood, and waferboard (OSB). <u>DOES NOT INCLUDE:</u> Laminates (Formica and melamine) and treated lumber. No large metal fasteners (nails are okay).

Not accepted:

- Construction debris loads of more than four cubic yards +
- Dirt, concrete, rocks, bricks, and other inert material +, ++
- Hazardous materials
- Liquids
- Manure +
- Ashes (dead or alive) +
- Asbestos +
- Bulky heavy items that may damage the transfer trailers or hinder unloading +

- ++ Accepted in Redmond


