The unit of measure for hypochlorite Solutions was not included on the HHW Packaging, Transportation and Management pricing list (page 19 of the Request for Bids). The unit of measure for this waste stream is a 5-gallon pail and the unit of measure for pricing is /pail. Bidders are instructed to fill in the blank items on page 19 of the Request for Proposals accordingly.

END OF ADDENDUM

Clarification #1

Several questions were brought to the attention of Deschutes County regarding the Request for Proposals. The following discussion items clarify those questions:

- 1. Waste disposal taxes and fees:** It is Deschutes County's intent that all costs associated with the management of wastes collected are included in the individual waste unit prices, including taxes and fees.
- 2. Supplies and materials charges:** It is Deschutes County's intent that all costs associated with the management of wastes collected be included in the unit prices, including packaging materials (containers, absorbents, etc). As to other supplies and materials (PPE, etc), it is Deschutes County's intent that those costs be included in the mobilization charge.
- 3. Definition/Qualifications of the Chemist:** In Deschutes County's experience with HHW operations, Contractors have always staffed an individual that functions as the site chemist. The chemist's role is making technical decisions on waste characterization, packaging compatibility, hazcating, etc. Deschutes County's intent is to differentiate between the person in this role and the technicians, who are essentially conducting labor duties (unloading, packaging, sorting, bulking, etc.) and the supervisor who oversees and directs the Contractor's activities. It is the County's expectation that the Contractor designate an appropriately qualified individual to function in that capacity, and has not specified a level of education or experience for that position.
