## **Curbside Recycling Guide - City of Sisters**





Blue Roll Cart

## Paper

- Magazines, junk mail, catalogs, phone books
- Paper, paper bags, mixed paper, envelopes, shredded strips of paper (no confetti)
- Newspaper (or anything that comes in the newspaper), wrapping paper (no foil or ribbon)
- Flattened corrugated cardboard (no waxed cardboard or frozen food boxes)
- Cereal, cracker, soda & beer cartons, paper egg cartons, paper towel tubes



### **Plastic**

#### (remove caps/lids & rinse clean)

- Plastic bottles & tubs (6 oz. or larger)
- Rigid plastic containers (such as yogurt & margarine tubs)
- Rigid plastic plant pots (4" or larger)
- Plastic buckets (5 gallons or less)
- Plastic milk jugs

# Tin & Aluminum (remove caps/lids & rinse clean)

- · Cans (labels ok)
- · Foil, pie tins & trays
- Beverage cans

### When in doubt, leave it out.



## Yard Debris

- Grass clippings, brush, weeds, pine needles, plant prunings, branches no larger than 2" in diameter x 36" in length, raw fruit & vegetable scraps, coffee grounds & filter, tea bags.
- Keep yard debris loose in roll cart; do not compact.
- Please do not put yard debris in plastic bags.



- Plastic bags are not recyclable curbside. Please recycle at participating grocery stores. Visit PlasticFilmRecycling.org for more information.
- Rigid plastic clamshells and hard plastics from produce or bakery items are not acceptable in your blue roll cart. Please dispose as trash.
- Polystyrene foam is not recyclable in your blue cart.
  Please bag as trash before disposing. Most mailing services will accept clean, bagged polystyrene packing peanuts.
- Glass and motor oil can be recycled at Sisters Recycle Center.

Bottles or jugs used to contain motor oil, pesticides, herbicides or other hazardous materials cannot be recycled. Please note that contaminated recycling may result in contamination or recycling charges.
